MIDDLE SCHOOL

Our Middle School Program starts from 8:30am to 2:30 pm, Monday to Friday. We welcome international students into our Middle School leading to our Secondary School (OSSD).

SECONDARY SCHOOL

We provide all credits leading to the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Full-time students are permitted to take 4 credits per semester. Part-time students are permitted to take a maximum of 2 credits in night school. To keep classes effective and student interaction to a maximum, class sizes are never larger than 10 students. Our alumni got 100% university admissions since 2004 when we became a full time Ontario Private Secondary School. Students come to excel and succeed at Queen's Collegiate.

LANGUAGE SCHOOL

BRIDGE SCHOOL

Our Bridge Program assists students who are in need of ESL. The program focuses on the many aspects of ESL: speaking, reading, writing, speaking, presentation and debate. This program assists students with the proper English tools needed for oral and written fluency in order to jump into Queen's Collegiate regular OSSD courses from grade 9 through 12.

AFTER SCHOOL

We continue to offer Tutorial classes all throughout the year with a **bundle package!** This package includes 4 hours of English and 2 hours each of science and math per week.

Each class reviews and previews course material, tailoring the course to engage the student in a small, diverse, class setting. We guarantee an improvement in marks! This is a unique tutorial program especially for international students whose native language is not English. With this program ESL students don't have to delay too much for completing OSSD. After School Programs are being offered to Queen's and non Queen's students.

SUMMER SCHOOL SESSIONS

Queen's Summer Sessions are composed of two sessions; July and August. Any students who need new credits or upgrading ones can come to register at Queen's Collegiate from public or private secondary schools. During these two sessions we also welcome students who would like to have some complementary tutoring classes to better understand their textbooks and future courses.
